1. In verses, 1-4: There are 19 verses before the 2 meditated scriptures and 16 verses after. We must look carefully at the verses to make at least 2 observation points before and after the meditated verse(s) and 5 observation points in the meditated verses. You must also note a minimum of 2 words in the concordance of the meditated verse(s) and 5 before and after the meditated verses for a total of 7 overall. An overview of the chapter shows 7 major divisions in the 37 verses. The first division is in verses 1-4. It deals with offences or traps (The KJV translates Strong's OFFENCES: G4625 in the following manner: offence (9x), stumbling block (3x), occasion of stumbling (1x), occasion to fall (1x), thing that offends (1x); a trap, snare, any person or thing by which one is (entrapped) drawn into error or sin), that cause another to sin.



The person that causes one to be entrapped or snared into sin is said that they're in serious trouble because "it would be better for them to have a **MILLSTONE:** The KJV translates Strong's **MILLSTONE:** G3037 in the following manner: stone (49x), one stone (4x), another (4x), stumbling stone, tied around their neck and to be thrown into the sea." These millstones were used to grind wheat or other grains into fine meal. One small circular one would be above the grain and one larger one below to cause the grinding to be effective.

The term "tied around the neck and thrown into the sea," = These things, snares causing one to sin, will happen, but pity the person that makes it happen. If someone causes another to sin they must have a severe **REBUKE**, The KJV translates Strong's **REBUKE**: G2008 in the following manner:

The causes another to sin they must have a severe (4x), straightly charge, to admonish or charge sharply. If the person that causes this error or stumbling to another repents for it, they should be forgiven; even if it happens seven times in a day.

In verses, 5-6: After hearing Jesus' admonition regarding offences, the non-repentented offender being attached to a millstone and thrown into the sea, rebuking them and then forgiving them once they have repented up to seven times in a day; they asked Jesus to increase their faith. Jesus told them that if they had faith as a grain of mustard seed, they would say unto this Sycamine tree to be removed and to be planted in the sea, it would obey you. We have spoken several times in the past that the power of the mustard seed that Jesus refers to is not towards its small size, being the smallest seed of all herbs in the world, but instead is towards its continuing growth. It grows to be a huge tree from its continuing, or diligence. So is our faith to continue to grow through diligence until it can do the impossible in human terms. **FAITH:** The KJV translates Strong's

FAITH: G4102 in the following manner: faith (239x), assurance (1x), believe (with G1537) (1x), belief (1x), them that believe (1x), fidelity, a strong and welcome conviction or belief that Jesus is the Messiah, through whom we obtain eternal salvation in the kingdom of God. Also, faith comes by hearing and hearing by the word of God. (Romans 10:17)

In verses, 7-10: Jesus continued speaking regarding the expectations of faith (I have come to understand that love, hope and faith are the major language or "cell phone" technology in God's Kingdom) by comparing those expectations to a servant that has just come in from working in the field, they would then prepare the meal for their employer and afterwards eat themselves. The Lord states the question, would that servant be thanked for what they are expected and paid to do? "I **TROW** not. The KJV translates Strong's TROW: G1380 in the following manner: think.

In verses, 11-19: As Jesus was passing through Samaria and Galilee in route to Jerusalem, 10 **LEPERS** approached him from a distance calling out, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us." Of course they were desiring to be cleansed of the leprosy. The KJV translates Strong's **LEPERS:** G3015 in the following manner: [leper] (9x). (Leprosy via www.dictionary.com a chronic, mildly infectious disease caused by Mycobacterium leprae, affecting the peripheral nervous system, skin, and nasal mucosa and variously characterized by ulcerations, tubercular nodules, and loss of sensation that sometimes leads to traumatic amputation of the anesthetized part. Jesus told them to go and show themselves to the priests. This was the customary process to bring about healing of those with leprosy. Although, the lepers had called on Jesus to have mercy on them and heal them as He had done with so many others, they followed His instructions, proceeding to go unto the priests. As they went in faith...and this is especially important, as faith comes by hearing a word from God. They were all cleansed of the leprosy. Only one, however returned to give glory to God while thanking Jesus with a loud voice. Jesus let him know that it was his.....not Jesus' faith that had made him whole.

In verses, 20-21: At this point, we have come to the meditated verses. The Pharisees hearing and seeing the miraculous healing of the 10 lepers while hearing the loud proclamations of the Samaritan, could not deny that these results were obviously through God and demanded that Jesus tell them "when is the **KINGDOM OF GOD** coming." The KJV translates Strong's **DEMANDED:**G1905 in the following manner: ask (53x), demand (2x), desire (1x), ask question (1x), question (1x), ask after (1x). to accost one with an enquiry, put a question to, enquiry of, ask, interrogate. They fully expected a throne to be upon an individual, palace, guards, army and of course the Roman armies to be dismissed from the land and the reestablishment of David's throne with all of the trimmings. Firstly, Jesus was not bringing a natural kingdom of man into the earth as witnessed by the teaching, preaching, healings, miracles, demonic deliverances and restored lives. The KJV translates Strong's **KINGDOM:** G932 in the following manner: kingdom (of God) (71x), kingdom (of heaven) (32x), royal power, kingship, dominion, rule, of the royal power of Jesus as the triumphant Messiah, a kingdom, the territory subject to the rule of a king. The KJV translates Strong's

GOD: G2316 in the following manner: God (1,320x), www.dictionary.com Kingdom of God - the spiritual domain over which God is

sovereign <u>spiritual domain</u>, <u>spiritual world</u>, <u>unseen</u> - a belief that there is a realm controlled by a divine spirit. Jesus went on to tell them that the Kingdom of God does not come with **OBSERVATION**. <u>The KJV translates Strong's</u>

OBSERVATION: G3907 in the following manner: observation (1x). inspection, i.e. ocular evidence:—observation, in such a manner that it can be watched with the eyes, i. e. in a visible manner. Jesus went on further to state, BEHOLD, the kingdom is within you. The KJV translates Strong's BEHOLD: G2400 in the following manner: behold (181x), (29x), (29x), see (3x). found in the N. T. especially in the Gospels of Matthew and of Luke, used very often in imitation of the Hebrew and giving a peculiar vivacity to the style by bidding the reader or hearer to attend to what is said: "Behold! See! Lo!" Jesus further stated that the Kingdom of God is within you. The lepers were cleansed from the inside outwardly. They came with mustard seed small faith from what they had heard of Jesus. They engaged directly in relationship with Jesus in calling out Jesus, Master, have mercy on us! Jesus responded with an answer, "go show yourself to the priests." They heard the word of God; faith comes by hearing and hearing by the word of God. (Rhema word from the mouth of God) They believed internally, received the word then acted on it by faith. Jesus again told the Samaritan, that his faith, not Jesus' had made him whole. So many are looking for something that they can feel, touch and see with ocular evidence...the Kingdom of God does not come via observation.

In verses, 22-32: Jesus told His disciples that the time would come when they will want and wish to see the days that they were seeing now with the **SON OF MAN**: The KJV translates Strong's **SON OF MAN**: G444 in the following manner: man (552x), not translated (4x), miscellaneous (3x). of from God and Christ. He said that they will say lo here and lo there is He, but do not follow after them. For as fast as the lightning flashes from this side of the earth to the other so shall His coming be. Jesus then said that this generation shall treat Him poorly and then reject Him. Jesus then made 3 comparisons of the past when sudden destruction came to mankind when they were eating, marrying, building, buying and being merry; He spoke of Noah's day before the flood, Lot's day before he was taken captive **SODOM** and Gomora after Lot's leaving came to a swift end through destruction. In all instances, sudden destruction came upon them. The KJV translates Strong's **SODOM**: G4670 in the following manner: Sodom (9x), Sodoma (1x). Sodom = "burning" a city destroyed by the Lord raining fire and brimstone on it. (Reminds me of the Covid-19...suddenly people were shut-up in houses, some jobs laid-off while others were permanently shuttered... suddenly) Then Jesus said, so shall it be when He returns, a man will be working on top of his roof and suddenly will have to leave, he should not try to come down and get objects from his home; he'll have to leave immediately! Sound like the Passover where they ate their food standing-up with coats, hats, scarfs and shoes on for their sudden departure? Here is a very relevant point, if people are not accustomed to the supernatural in their daily lives then how will they leave in the rapture? Will the rapture be supernatural? Yes. Will jets take us to glory? No.

In verses, 33-37: Jesus then stated that he who gives up his life for Jesus' sake shall gain it and he that holds unto his worldly-life shall lose it. When Jesus returns there will be two shall be in one bed the one will be taken the other left, two shall be in the field, one will be taken the other left and then two women will be grinding together one will be taken and the other left. **Then Jesus' disciples spoke up, "But where will this happen, Lord?" Jesus said, "Where there is a corpse, there will always be buzzards."**
